Objective

Identify the roles of different individuals in the garden and the importance of diversity.

Summary of Tasks

(1) Discuss roles in the garden. Ask questions: What tasks are there in the garden? Who is responsible for what? Why is it important that we maintain our responsibilities and obligations in the garden?

(2) Work as a class to identify each others strengths in taking care of the garden.

(3) Each student creates a "This is Me" feature of themselves. They should first draw picture of themselves in the garden, second write how they like to help in the garden, third write what they find difficult in the garden and fourth what they want to learn how to do in the garden. This will serve as Page 1 in their Journal.

Objective

To learn about the traditional medicinal properties of plants in the garden. To understand the importance of medicinal plants to BVI traditional culture.

Summary of Tasks

(1) Teacher teaches what medicinal plants we have in the garden, what they are good for (eg. lemongrass for fever, heat) and how to use them (eg. use the lemon grass you make a tea).

(2) As a class go into the garden and harvest a **small** amount of each medicinal plant. Ask the questions: What part of the plant is this? What does it smell like? What does it feel like?

(3) In class, discuss with students the properties of each plant. Encourage students that already know to share their experiences.

(4) Assemble recycled items for students to use to build boxes. This can be plastic, cardboard, fabric, etc. They can decorate individually.

(5) Assist students in gathering a small amount of each herb themselves to place in their Medicine Box.

(6) Students will use a page in their journal to write a reflection about this activity.
