Objective

Understand the local food system and where students can get local food from

Summary of Tasks

- (1) As a class brainstorm where you can get local produce. Ask the questions: what food can we find in our community? From where?
- (2) Each student selects a food to prepare and brings in this food to share with the class. Students should document where they sourced all the materials to prepare their dish.
- (3) After consuming the locally made meal, collect from the class where they got their produce.
- (4) With this information create a food map that shows where they got their locally produced food.
- (5) Present this food map to assembly to start a conversation about our local food system
